



3. Samsung Galaxy Tab S6--The Best Android Note Taking Tablet

5. ReMarkable 2--The Best E-Ink Note Taking Tablet

ReMarkable is an e-ink paper tablet for taking notes, reading documents or ebooks with a paper-like feel. Compared with all the above tablets which have an LCD-based screen, reMarkable offers an eye-friendly reading experience without backlight, glare or eye strain. And compared with some other eReaders like Kindle, reMarkable lets you easily make notes on your documents, which can't be done on an ereader.

Compared with the first generation model that's released a few years ago, ReMarkable 2 improved a lot and made a breakthrough in many aspects. ReMarkable 2 is now available as a pre-order and will ship in July 2020. Personally speaking, I prefer this paper tablet in particular among all the note taking devices in the market.
